The Congress of the Chambers of Commerce of the Empire, during its recent meeting in London, passed two very important resolutions, one in favor of Reciprocal Tariff Preference in trade between the various parts of the Empire...

and timely. It should have a strong influence in focusing public opinion in all countries under the flag, and in bringing them all to agreement on an united policy for the strategic defense of an united Empire.

The resolution seems to be entirely in agreement with the views often expressed by Mr. Borden, the present Prime Minister of Canada. Both out of office and in office he has laid it down as an article of policy that Canada must assume some of the responsibility for the naval defense of the Empire.

Again, the resolution is evidently wise from a Canadian and Defense point of view. No Dominion of the Empire can, at the present time, undertake the enormous task of independent and efficient naval defense, and any such defense that would not be efficient would at once be condemned by that very fact.

Happily for Canada, she is safe and secure under the protection of the Royal Navy of the Empire. There is no need to bleed herself white for naval defense, as would be required by an efficient and independent scheme.
