

SIX BABES AT A BIRTH.

Gloucester-Sormany, Legere. Two Pair of Triplets Born to Ohio Couple. - Two Expected to

Live.

Steubenville, Feb. 28—Six perfectly formed children were born here today to Mr. and Mrs. George Campbell, Three of the infants died within an hour after birth. One boy and girl will live, it is said. Three were boys. Mrs. Campbell weighs less than a hundred pounds. The combined weight of the infants was twenty-three pounds. Physicians declare the case to be one of the most remarkable known. Campbell is a mill worker, and has four brothers. To the family of two of these twins have been born, and each of the other brothers is father of triplets.

Campbell's first wife died after becoming the mother of triplets.
