The Airco express areoplanes, which fly daily between London and Paris, on Saturday completed their sixth week of continuous operation.

"I started this service," said Mr. Holt Thomas on Sunday, "to show that esides providing transport at 100

miles an hour, aeroplanes can now be flown to a time-table in bad weather. We have since we began scheduled 86 flights. Of these, though on 28 days polished no fewer than 83. Only one fight had to be abandoned through weather. On that day conditions were vorse than they had been for years. The progress of another flight was inlow clouds. As a proof that the aeroplane is no longer unreliable, I may mention that once only during 20,750 miles flying has a pilot alighted through mechanical trouble.
