Inventor of the Lightning Rod.

Benjamin Franklin, who was born in Boston, Massachusetts, in 1706, has the unusual distinction of displaying notable ability, not only as a scientist and philosopher, but also as a very practical politician. For some years he represented the interests of Pennsylvania in London, and was active in the agitation against the Stamp Act passed in the British Parliament imposing new heavy duties on imports. Although at first he undoubtedly did his best to keep the dispute from ending in disaster, a regrettable incident connected with the purloining and publication of private letters, however, led to his return to America, where he participated in the deliberations that produced the Declaration of Independence. From 1773 to 1785, Franklin was accredited Minister to France and co-operated in the settlement of the Treaty of Versailles. Yet, busy and successful in affairs as he was in affairs of State, he would not have acquired widespread and enduring fame but for his labors in the scientific field. Led by the discovery of the Leyden Jar in 1745 to investigate the nature of electricity and the part played in Nature by the new power, he reached the conclusion that electricity and lightning were identical and thus was prompted to devise his famous lightning rod. When it is remembered that he worked for five years as a printer, conducted for a time the "Pennsylvania Gazette," and produced in "Poor Richard's Al-

Lobster Fishery Opens this Month.

GOOD DEMAND IN THE FOREIGN MARKETS.
The lobster fishery on that section of the coast between St. Mary's and St. George's will commence on the 24th of this month. During this week the St. John's dealers who are interested directly in this fishery, were quite busy fitting out the Packers with a supply of lobster cans, rope, solder, etc. The Union Canning Co. reports that, judging from the orders that have come in for tins, the fishery will be prosecuted the coming season on a larger scale than any year since 1914.

There is good demand for lobster in the foreign market, and scores of orders, received here for tinned lobster the past three months had to be turned down because there were no lobsters here to go forward. The lobster fishery in Nova Scotia has not been a success and so far is a good deal short of the normal.

The price this year for Newfoundland pack will be such as to encourage all who have the outfit to go into the business, especially as the markets are all cleaned out. It is believed that the local market will open at \$22.00 to \$23.00 per case of 48 one-pound tins.—Trade Review.
