Two Unpopular Sovereigns

The climax of one of the most did episodes in English history was when the trial of Caroline of Brunswick, consort of George IV, was commenced before the House of Lords August 19, 1820. It is impossible to posterity to sympathize much with either party, for Caroline had caused much scandal, George had caused more. But the unpopularity of the matter was so great that it suited to cover a multitude of sins in the Queen's cause with turbulent enthusiasm. The other side, however, supported effectively with ridicule and epigrams, of which, perhaps, the most pointed was inspired by the late Queen's leading counsel, who Brougham, who referred to the natural precedent of the woman taken in adultery.

Most gracious Queen! we these To go away and sin no more; Or, if that effort be too great To go away, at any rate!

In fact, sober-minded citizens had grown heartily sick of the squabble, which eventually came to an impotent end. For, at the reading in the Lords, the majority dwindled to nine, and Ministers dropped the Bill of Pains and Penalties without submitting it to the Commons. Queen Caroline did not long survive to vex her husband. On Coronation Day she presented herself at the Abbey, but was refused admission, and the rebuff is said to have proved her death-blow. At all events she died within a month (August 1821) aged 52; and her body, occupying one last noisy demonstration on the way through London, was taken to Brunswick for interment.
