His Lordship, Mr. Justice Mc-Kenzie, adjourned the case till to-July 8th, as scheduled, before he morrow morning and placed Dickie in the care of Sheriff McKim. Hearing of the case began shortly before three o'clock this afternoon. The only witnesses called were the girl in the case and her girl companions, both of whom left the Maritime Home for Girls, of which they were

inmates, on the night of May 15th, and were subsequently located at Halifax and brought back to the Home. Mr. Vernon, for the accused, and Attorney General O'Hearn, for the Crown, addressed the jury at considerable length, after which his Lordship delivered his charge. At 4.30 the

jury retired, returning one hour later with a verdict of guilty. There was much interest in the case and the court room was crowded. This afternoon Mr. Justice Mc-Kenzie imposed sentence of two years in the penitentiary at Dorchester upon Reuben Johnson (colored) who was convicted yesterday of an offence

against a girl over fourteen years of age and under sixteen years of age. His counsel, Mr. Vernon, in asking for leniency in the sentence, pointed out that Johnson had served voluntarily in the war for three years. The Attorney General stated he was not opposed to a lenient sentence.
