In discussions of these matters in the other Provinces by the press and by politicans who were not thoroughly informed on the subject, the impression is made that this Province obtained some extraordinary advantage over some of the other Provinces by the Act of Confederation. We are told that while before the Union we were complaining of constant deficits, since that time this Province has waxed rich and had a large surplus; while the real truth is that were we to devote the revenues accruing to the Government of Ontario from general sources to the same purposes that public money is devoted in the other Provinces, we would be obliged to resort to direct taxation to a very large extent 10 mect our expenses.—In order to show this more clearly, he stated that while Ontario paid far more than any of the other Provinces for education, she did of pay half what any of the other Provinces for ducation, she did of pay half what any of the other Province of a subsidy of of \$1,116,872.80, being 20 cents per head of the population of 67, and an additional amount agreed to by the Conference at London, of \$80,000, making the total receipts from the Dominion \$1,196,872.80. This of course was subject to the reduction on account of interest on our debt of \$201,666.66, the actual amount received being about one million in round numbers. He regretted that from some misunderstanding of the relative duties of municipal officers and the Government, in procuring returns required by law, that he had not been able to get returns of Municipal statisties for a later period than 1868. The amount raised by Municipal Councils for that year was \$3,151,085. He added, as a very reasonable addition for the four succeeding years, \$350,000.
