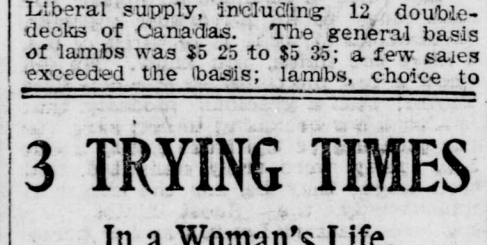

CLEARING OUT THE GUERRILLAS

Lord Roberts' Report of Recent Operations.

Complaints of the Cowboys and Muleteers From South Africa.

Expenses of the War Expected to Total Fully \$500,000,000—Praise for Canadians.

London, Nov. 13.—Under date of Johannesburg, Nov. 12, Lord Roberts telegraphs to the war office as follows:

"Rundie reports skirmishes with small parties of Boers in the Harrismith, Reitz and Vrede districts recently. The commandoes appear to be acting independently and with no object except to give as much annoyance as possible to the British.

"Douglas arrived at Ventersdorp on Nov. 11, from Zeirust, capturing during the march 21 prisoners and a quantity of cattle and sheep.

One hundred and forty American cowboys and muleteers who went to South Africa on British mule transports arrived in London Saturday.

They are loud in their denunciation of their treatment on the home journey, and intend to formally complain to the board of trade. They declare the rations served had to be thrown overboard; that they would have starved had they not paid exorbitant rates for extra rations, and that they were berthed over horse stalls, where the heat and odor were unbearable.

Parliament will assemble Dec. 3 to vote the expenses of the war in South Africa, which are now expected to amount to fully £100,000,000.
