Latest Apparatus Installed, First-Class Library and Individual Instruction.

The medical department of the Western University will reopen on Oc-Waterloo and York streets, in lieu of a new medical building, which had to be deferred pending the close of the only facilitate the work of the school but will greatly add to the comfort and convenience of the students.




