The positions will be filled by applicants whose experience and qualifications comply with the requirements of the service. The civil service commission announces competitive examinations for the posi-The department

and colonization has reorganized its overseas and United States services The work has created a number of new positions for immigration agents. It has been the policy of the government to attract as large a number of suitable immigrants as pos sible to Canada. Farm help is badly needed in Canada and particularly in Western Ontario at the present time It is necessary that the persons appointed should be of the very best type and able to qualify, states a communication from W. Foran, secratary of the civil service commission, received by Gordon Philip, secretary of the Chamber of Commerce, today.

Immigration agents of grade one and grade two will be required. The salary to start is \$1,560 and \$1,920 respectively, per year. The duties are to assist in the promotion of suitable immigration to Canada. To make personal interviews with prospective immigrants, and so on pective immigrants, and so on.
Qualifications are: Education equivalent to high school graduation, four years' practical experience in Canadian farming and a general knowledge of farming methods of the Dominion.
