DOG DITCHES CAR ON PLYMPTON DETOUR

Jas. Wiseman, of Wyandotte, Killed; Others Injured, When Car Turns Over

One person was killed and two others injured in an automobile accident at 8 a.m., Saturday, on the London road detour, when a large American touring car went into the ditch after running over and killing a dog.

James Wiseman, of Wyandotte, Mich., died instantly from a broken neck. His wife is in the Sarnia General hospital with serious injuries to her back. Larry Wilson of Wyandotte driver of the car, had his shoulder broken. Mrs. S. Fincham of Mimico, and her two children and Miss Margaret Churchur of Detroit, the remaining passengers in the car, escaped injury.

The car was proceeding to Toronto and Mimico, when a half-mile east of the Camlachie sideroad, a dog ran across the path, and as the wheel passed over the animal the car went out of control and turned on its side in a two-foot ditch. Mr. Wiseman was thrown out into the road and died almost instantly. His wife was thrown out of the other side of the car and rendered unconscious. The dog, which was the cause of the accident was killed.

Mrs. Wiseman had recovered sufficiently to leave the Sarnia Hospital and proceed to Toronto on Monday.
