the Council took the matter up again, and ordered Mr. Frank Stewart, the clerk, to forward \$130 to Mr. Ericson for a new set of limbs. Finlay offered the money back to the Council, but they refused to accept it. I wish my readers to know that whatever help Booth ever received was only to provide him with limbs, and that in only two cases out of four purchases he made.

For the last three years Finlay has been living with his niece, Mrs. Beaudry, and looking after their stock. At the present time, while these pages are being prepared, he is engaged selling silverware for the Silver Plate Company, of Windsor, Ontario.
