**PRESENT:****HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR**  
**GENERAL IN COUNCIL.****ON** the recommendation of the Honorable the Min-  
ister of Customs, and under the authority given  
by the Act 31 Vic. Cap. 12, Sec. 58, intituled: "An  
Act respecting the Public Works of Canada." His  
Excellency has been pleased to order, and it is hereby  
ordered, that from and after this day the rate of toll  
payable on Ice passing through the Welland Canal,  
shall be, and the same is hereby reduced from twenty  
cents to five cents per ton,—such reduction to cease  
and determ ne after the expiration of the current  
year, when, unless otherwise ordered, the existing toll  
of twenty cents per ton shall revive and continue in

**GOVERNMENT HOUSE, OTTAWA,**

Friday, 9th day of April, 1869.

**PRESENT:****HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR**  
**GENERAL IN COUNCIL.****WHEREAS** under the Tariff of Canal tolls adopted  
and established by order in Council of the 15th  
day of April A. D., 1863, Peat is subject to the high  
rates of toll imposed thereby on unenumerated goods  
and merchandise, which are placed in the 6th class  
of that Tariff:And whereas, it is expedient that Peat, which is  
now an article of traffic in Canada, should be placed,  
as regards Canal Tolls, on the same footing as Coal,  
and rated on the 3rd class of that Tariff,—His Excellency in Council, on the recommendation  
of the Honorable the Minister of Customs, and  
under the authority given by the 58th section of the  
Act 31 Vic., Cap. 12, intituled: "An Act respecting  
the Public Works of Canada," has been pleased to  
order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after  
this date, Peat shall be, and it is hereby placed in  
the 3rd class of the Tariff referred to, and subject to  
the payment of the rates of Canal toll prescribed for  
articles enumerated in that class.**W. H. LEE,**
