### ... HOW TO REMIT ...

Correspondents are requested, before ordering stamps, sets, packets or other goods offered by us in the MESSENGER, to read carefully the following notices.

**POSTAGE IS EXTRA.** Remittances should be made by Postal Note, Post Office or Express Money Order, or Bank Notes at current rates of exchange.

United States bank notes and silver are accepted at face to any amount, and U. S. stamps (up to \$1.00 only) at 5% discount.

Canadian correspondents will find postal notes convenient for small remittances, but where these cannot be readily obtained, stamps or silver will be accepted.

Correspondents in other British Colonies until further notice may remit in stamps to any amount. Sets ( $\frac{1}{2}$ c. to 25c.) and new or provisional issues are preferred.

From correspondents in Foreign Countries we will accept current unused stamps up to \$1.00, if in sets of at least five values and well centred.
