Canadian correspondents will find postal notes convenient for small remittances, but waere these cannot be readily obtained, stamps or silver will be accepted.

Correspondents in other British Colonies until further notice may remit in stamps to any amount. Sets (½c. to 25c.) and new or provisional issues are preferred.

From correspondents in Foreign Countries we will accept current unused stamps up to 1.00, if in sets of at least five values and well centred.
