THE MEETING OF SYNOD

The Synod of the Maritime Provinces met in Fort Massey Church on Tuesday the 9th inst, at 7.30 p. m.

Rev. Dr. McKnight, the retiring moderator preached the opening sermon from Matt. 20,42—"What think ye of Christ.

He said:-It is the prerogative of man to think and to express his thoughts in speech. Our Lord had taken for granted that the Pharisees had exercised their minds in thought on the Old Testament Scriptures which they possessed, and he asks what opinions they have formed with regard to the Messiah of whom: these Scriptures speak.
