

Controls Hemorrhage

HEMOSTATIC SERUM is a blood-serum derivative which contains substances essential in shortening the coagulation-time of the blood.

It is indicated in the treatment of hemorrhage of the new-born, purpura, hemoptysis, hematemesis, typhoid hemorrhage, etc.

It is indicated as a prophylactic against hemorrhages that usually attend certain surgical procedures, such as bone operations, tonsillectomy, amputations, and operations on the spleen and gall-bladder.

Hemostatic Serum is injected subcutaneously, intramuscularly or intravenously, the average dose being 2 cc. It is also applied locally to the site of the hemorrhage by means of a piece of sterile gauze.

Packages of 2-cc and 5-cc vials.
