- Alden, Cynthia Westover.** "Women's Ways of Earning Money." New York: A. S. Barnes & Co. \$1. This is the first volume in Mrs. Sangster's Woman's Home Library, and it is an excellent beginning. It provides for women what Dr. Smiles' "Self Help" has long provided for the sterner sex. Practical, commonsense advice is supplied as to how women can earn their living, and the number of ways disclosed seems legion. A carefully compiled index gives a key to the various openings before women.
- Brownell, Clarence L.** "The Heart of Japan." London: Methuen & Co. 6d.
- Coolidge, Emelyn L.** "The Mother's Manual." New York: A. S. Barnes & Co. \$1 net. Volume II. in "Woman's Home Library." A valuable text-book for the young mother, supplying all needful information for the care of the baby from birth to the seventh year. The authoress has been connected with the Babies' Hospital in New York, and speaks from intimate acquaintance with her subject. A useful index enables the possessor of the book to secure information quickly in case of emergency.
- Horne, John.** "Starting Points for Speakers, Preachers, Writers and Other Thinkers." Edinburgh: Oliphant, Anderson & Ferrier. 2s 6d. A remarkable, as well as a valuable book. A thought is suggested by one of the black line side headings; it is worked out in a paragraph culled from some authority, and thus the key to a whole speech or sermon is supplied. By means of a carefully compiled index, the possessor of the book is enabled to pick out subjects congenial to him.
- Madge's Book of Cookery.** Containing over 1,000 practical recipes of an up-to-date and economical description. London: Horace Marshall & Son. Price, 1 shilling. This is a new and cheap edition of the famous cook book compiled by Mrs. Humphry, "Madge" of Truth. It is bound in a red cardboard cover, is well printed and well-indexed. Besides the recipes, part of the book is devoted to home management, including nursing, domestic economy, and household hints.
- Step, Edward, F. L. S.** "Wayside and Woodland Trees." A pocket guide to the British Sylva. London: Frederick Warne & Co. Price, 6s. Pocket size, 6 1-2 x 4 1-2 in. An admirable text-book for the lover of trees, handsomely illustrated with 128 photographic plates. The photographs include the Summer and Winter aspects of various trees, and large scale pictures and their boles. The reading matter is illuminated with literary allusions, and enters so thoroughly and sympathetically into the subject that the reader soon becomes an enthusiast.
- Thwing, Charles F.** "College Training and the Business Man." New York: D. Appleton & Co. \$1 net. Postage, 9c. A comprehensive volume in small compass, dealing with the college man in general administration, banking, transportation, insurance and human relations.
