Independent Discussions

A s part of TCS Centenary activities, the views of the Canadian business community are being sought to identify the trends and issues affecting the Service in its second century.

Since Canada's first Trade Commissioner, John Short Larke, began promoting Canadian interests in Australia one hundred years ago, the Trade Commissioner Service (TCS) has continually evolved to meet the changing needs of its business clientele. Recognizing that Canadian international business practitioners are well placed to define their requirements for the Service in the future, the Department is gathering their independent opinions in a

TCS Centenary project.

The project, titled "Launching the Second Century", aims to identify the issues and trends that could affect the Service in its second century. It will involve a series of one-day cross-Canada, mini-consultation conferences, scheduled in the early summer, which will act as fora for debate and discussion.
