## PRAYERS.

The Order being read for the third reading of Bill C-202, An Act to prevent pollution of areas of the arctic waters adjacent to the mainland and islands of the Canadian arctic;

Mr. Chrétien, seconded by Mr. Greene, moved,—That the said bill be now read a third time and do pass.

And debate arising thereon;

Mr. Baldwin, seconded by Mr. Crouse, proposed to move, in amendment thereto,—That all the words after “now” be left out and there be substituted therefor the words “re-committed to the Standing Committee on Indian Affairs and Northern Development with an instruction to amend the Bill by adding thereto, immediately after clause 27 thereof, page 23, the following:

28. Nothing in this Act shall in any way be construed to be inconsistent with Canada's rightful claim of sovereignty in and over water, ice and land areas of the Arctic regions between the degrees of longitude 60 and longitude 141;

and by renumbering clause 28 of the Bill, page 23, as clause 29.”
