It certainly will not be reached in the first year; that is quite evident. In the meantime the amendment would have added to the charges upon the crown. Therefore I think it is quite clear that this amendment is out of order. It is not the kind of amendment that can be introduced by a private member of this house.

The Chairman: I do not think I have much difficulty in upholding the view of the minister. It seems to me that the purpose of the bill is clearly set out in the explanatory note at the beginning. Furthermore, I would say that if we considered the amendment from another aspect it would widen the scope of the bill. Therefore, for those two reasons, I rule this amendment out of order.

Mr. Herridge: Mr. Chairman, we agree with the view advanced by the hon. member for Bonavista-Twillingate, that this does not increase the total financial responsibility of the government. Therefore I appeal your ruling.
