SECOND MAJOR AIRPORT IN TORONTO AREA—MOTION UNDER S.O. 43

**Mr. Jim Fleming (York West):** Mr. Speaker, I rise, in accordance with Standing Order 43, on a matter of urgent and pressing necessity.

Considering that the ever-increasing air traffic volumes at Toronto international airport have led more and more to the use of the two major east-west runways on a joint basis for incoming and outgoing flights, rather than on a rotational basis, and considering that this practice not only increases dramatically the total disruption and interference to the life-style and environment of thousands of my constituents but proves that the Government of Canada was correct in its plans for a second airport designed to avoid such disruption and suffering to people, I move, seconded by the hon. member for Peel-Dufferin-Simcoe (Mr. Milne):

That this House reconfirm the need for a second major airport facility for the Toronto area, and urges the government of Ontario to admit their error in blocking a second airport and now to work in co-operation with the federal government to urgently seek a solution.

FREIGHT RATES IN NEWFOUNDLAND—MOTION UNDER S.O. 43

In view of the fact that the Secretary of State for External Affairs, when minister of transport in September, 1969, removed a freeze from railway freight rates and as a result freight rates have since increased 136.62 per cent in Newfoundland, and since CN has developed a rate structure for Newfoundland to drive all freight offering off the railway, as is proven by the fact that if a Newfoundlander is transferred from St. John's to Vancouver and wishes to ship his automobile to Vancouver by rail, it will cost him \$4,497 from St. John's, but only \$571 from Halifax or \$548 from Moncton, and that these are the rates despite the fact that Newfoundland is a part of and adjacent to Canada, and not an island in the South China Sea, I move, seconded by the hon. member for St. John's East (Mr. McGrath):

That the Secretary of State for External Affairs, or the Minister of Transport, or both, explain on motions why.
