

Extract from letter of

S. A. MACKENZIE

President of Dalhousie University.

I have just received your letter of the 25th, in which you tell me of a friend of yours who has been advised not to send his son to Dalhousie, because he will be badly handicapped unless he had a fair knowledge of the French language. In reply let me say that there is nothing whatsoever in this contention. Dalhousie does not differ from any other reputable University in its language requirements, unless it be that we live up to the standard that we set forth in the calendar and do not pass people when they ought not to be passed.
