Of course the Oxford University Press is equally well known for its many learned publications and school books. The greatest enterprise that any University or printing-press has taken in hand since the invention of printing is 'The Oxford English Dictionary.' But space forbids even the barest reference to other works which have secured for the Press a great reputation throughout the world.

That the arrangements which the Hymnal Committee made with Mr. Frowde have proved eminently satisfactory is shown by the resolution passed by the Executive Committee, and recorded on a previous page.
