Speed of trains.	(a.) Limiting the rate of speed at which railway trains and locomotives may be run in any city, town or village, or in any class of cities, towns or villages described in any regulation ; and, if the Board thinks fit, the rate of speed within certain described portions of any city, town or village, and allowing another rate of speed in other portions thereof,—which rate of speed shall not in any case exceed six miles an hour, unless the track is properly protected ;	30
