

THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL I⁸.

An Act for the relief of Samuel Goldberg.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Samuel Goldberg, domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, clerk, has by his petition alleged that on the twenty-seventh day of August, A.D. 1942, at the said city, he and Irene Mary Edith Baraneck, who was then of the said city, a spinster, were married; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, because of her adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Samuel Goldberg and Irene Mary Edith Baraneck, his wife, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Samuel Goldberg may at any time hereafter marry any woman whom he might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Irene Mary Edith Baraneck had not been solemnized.
