They number 150, and include plums of very many different capacities. varieties, peaches, apricots, cultivated black berries, strawberries, white, red, and black currants, grapes, pears, and apples, as well as vegetables, such as hears and pears, and represent the growth of the districts of New Westminster, Victoria, Vancouver, Chilliwhack, Lulu Island, Ladners Landing, Port Hummond, etc They form probably the best collection of Pacific fruit that has ever reached this country. -Canadian Gazette.
