have been carried many trees, and whole skeletons of sea animals, to the height of 30 fathoms, or more, above the surface of the sea [above the common water mark, or level]: from which our author judges, that, in the year 1737, there happened, likewife, here [in this island] such an inundation as that at Kamtchatka.

Earthquakes happen [here] feveral times in the year. The most violent, that was observed, was in the beginning of February, which, during a westerly wind, lasted exactly fix minutes; and before it was heard a noise, and a strong wind, under ground, with a hisfing, which went from fouth to north.

Among mineral things, which are found in that island, one may reckon, as the most remarkable, the fine waters, which, upon account of their purenels and lightness, are very wholfome: and this virtue of them was observed upon fick people, with advantage, and the defired fatisfaction. With regard to the plentifulnefs of them, there is not a valley but what has a fream running through it; and the number of them all together exceeds fixty; among which there are fome, which are from 8 to 12 fathoms broad; and fome are two, and fome even 5 fathoms deep, when the water is high; but there are few fuch, and the greater part of them is extremely shallow at the mouth; becaufe that they have a very rapid courfe, on account of the steep flopes of the vallies, and that near the fea they divide into many rivulets.
