Concluding, he exposed the shiftings and evasions of his opponent on this vital question of freedom t legislation, education and turnied the light of logis on the latter's posturings in a manner that drove coercionists present to a frenzy of resentment.

Scott, he declared, was a discredited man, untrue to every principle of his political life, a confessed betrayer of his province, one who got position by that means, and who would hold it by equally criminal methds. Let them, therefore, vote for their own and their children's rights.

The coercionist premier was well received, but during the whole course of his speech avoided entirely the main issue—whether or not Saskatchewan is to be free and the exemption and the part he alleges that the corporation was taking in that contest.
