THAT GERMAN-AMERICAN CABLE. Enough Business Pledged and

Guaranteed to Make the Project a Success.

London, Jan. 21 .- The Frankfort correspondent of The Financial News says, relative to the projected cable between Germany and the United States, that he is informed that certain agreements have been made with American cable companies, \$7 which the cable itself must be manufactured in England and laid by way of the

tured in England and laid by way of the Azores Islands. The American companies in question have pledged themselves to use the new line for the transmission of their despatches to and from Germany. The German postoffice has guaranteed the trans-mission of a certain number of words, and the profitable working of the line is there-fore said to be fully assured. The shares capital will possibly be not less than 20 million marks.
