Eastern Ontario High Court of Foresters Elected Their Officers Yesterday at Kingston.

Kingston, Ont., Aug. 25.—The election of officers occupied all the forenoon session at the Eastern Ontario High Court of Independent Order of Foresters. They were: H.C.R., George Spence, Cobourg; H.V.C.R., W. Fraser, Ottawa; H. Secretary, H. L. Dickson, Manotick; H. Treasurer, J. S. B. McLean, Kingston; H. Physician, W. B. Chalmers, M.P., Cayuga; High Councilors, A. Payne, Campbellford; High Auditors, S. Lowe, Kingston; W. Brown, Ottawa.

M. B. Malory, retiring treasurer, was presented with a handsome clock. Fraternal greetings were received from the Old-fellows' Relief Association, Kingston, and the Ancient Order of Foresters, in session at Toronto.

At the afternoon session it was decided to divide the jurisdiction of the High Court into 27 districts, with district deputies in each district, who shall communicate with said courts, and visit them when requested. During the year 12 courts were organized. The next meeting of the High Court will be held at Brockville.

The Grand Court of Appeal was conferred on Bro. C. D. Clark, Past Chief Ranger, and now Assistant Supreme Physician. At this evening's session the finance report was discussed, and recommendations for mission work and other expenditures were made. The expenditure amounted to \$5,738.85; receipts \$5,970.90, leaving a surplus of \$232.05.

To Compromise With Miners. Grand Forks, B.C., Aug. 18.—Clarence J. McNaught, the well-known Montreal mining man, will shortly revisit the Slocan, Republic and the Boundary country. It is reported here that his western trip will be undertaken largely with a view to compromise with the miners, and the early resumption of work in the Payne tunnel. Mr. Wilkes, the organizer of the Miners' Union, was in town to-day. He is engaged in forming branches of the union throughout the country. Speaking about the situation in the Slocan he said: "I expect to see work resumed in the mines very shortly. One thing is certain, the eight-hour law will not be repealed."

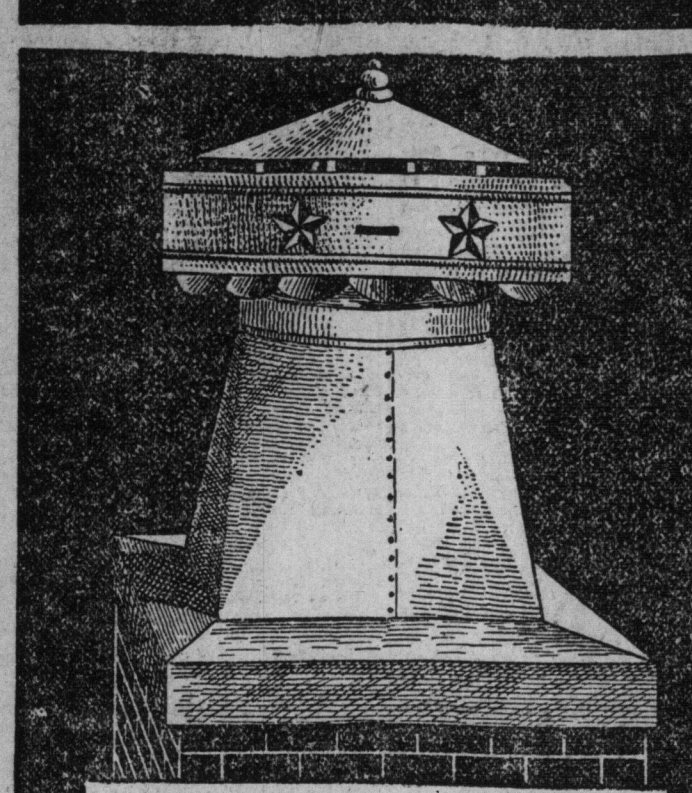
