London, Jan. 26, 1900.

Dear Sir.—I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 10th Inst., in which you state that the Canadian branch has appointed Lieut. Col. G. Sterling Ryerson, M.D., with the consent of the Government of Canada, special commissioner to accompany the Canadian contingent to the Cape, and you express the hope that this society will approve of the action thus taken by its branch.

In reply, I am desired by Lord Wantage to inform you that the subject of your letter has been before the Central Committee and has met with its entire approval. Lord Wantage and the committee consider that the appointment of Dr. Ryerson is a very proper one under the circumstances, and that the Canadian contingent will no doubt greatly benefit by the experience which Dr. Ifyerson will be able to bring to bear on led Cross work in connection with the Canadian contingent.
