**TO HAVE MANUAL TRAINING**

**Minister of Education Offers the Services of a Teacher to the City of Hamilton**

**AT A COST OF ONLY \$150 A TERM**

It is immediately Accepted—Residents at the Beach Opposite a Railway.

Hamilton, Sept. 18.—A special meeting of the Board of Education was held this evening to consider the Minister of Education's offer to provide for the teaching of manual training in the Ontario Normal College and Collegiate Institute.

These were the terms of the offer: “I have decided to make your board this offer: (1) Provide a teacher (William Bailey), for the coming Normal College year; (2) provide the benches and tools for twenty-five pupils; (3) your board to set aside a suitable room and provide all necessary material; (4) the benches and tools to be primarily, and to the full extent required, to the Normal College students; (5) this agreement to be for the coming (academic) year only, it will be held to bear from your reply at once.”

As the cost to the board will be only \$150 a year, the members accepted the proposition. Mr. Bailey, the teacher mentioned, is one of those brought out from England by Sir William McDonald, who will give technical instruction to the teachers in training, and the rest to the pupils of the Collegiate Institute.

**Strange Accident.**

**ENCOURAGEMENT GIVEN.**

Ottawa, Sept. 18.—(Special).—So closely associated with Canadian politics is the policy of inter-Imperial preferential trade upon which Mr. Chamberlain has broken away from the British cabinet, that Canadian Cabinet Ministers decline to discuss publicly the situation in the Mother Country. Privately, however, the Ministers express regret at the departure of Mr. Chamberlain from the Colonial office. Several members of parliament with whom the subject was discussed admitted that Mr. Chamberlain's resignation attests that a preferential arrangement with Great Britain is farther off than it was generally supposed in this country to be.

John Charlton, who is a member of the Joint High Commission, was asked if he thought the postponement of a British preference would have any material effect in stimulating the resumption of negotiations for a reciprocity treaty with the United States. Mr. Charlton in credit with being personally of the opinion that there will be another meeting of the commission as soon as possible after the prorogation of parliament, and he is known to entertain strong hopes of being able to bring about more favorable trade relations with the United States. But he excused himself from discussing the effect of the preferential sentiment in Canada upon the disposition of Canada to treat with the United States for reciprocity.

Mr. Charlton said: “The resignation of Mr. Chamberlain is an unmistakable indication that a division of opinion exists in the British cabinet upon the trade question, and it may be taken for granted that the present administration will not assume to act upon the views he entertains. It would seem probable that the effect of the resignation of Mr. Chamberlain, and also of Mr. Ritchie would be to bring the Liberals back into power at the next election. This result, in all probability might be followed by complications which would make their lease of office short-lived, and would in the near future in the triumph of protectional principles in Great Britain.
