MOURN LOSS OF MURDERED BROTHER. How Chicago Union Men Regard Strike Consequences to One of Themselves.

Chicago, May 14.—Marching with draped banners and muffled drums, more than 3000 union men today followed the body of George S. Pierce, a striking teamster, who was killed by a deputy sheriff, from his home to the Union Station, whence the body was taken to Louisville, Ky., for burial.

When the station was reached, the column extended ten blocks. A brass band led the procession. Eight other striking teamsters were honorary pall-bearers.

Pierce was shot by Special Detective P. P. Waldorf, and is the only union man who has lost his life during the strike. Pierce is said to have assaulted a street car driver in the presence of Waldorf, who was exonerated by a coroner's jury.
