German Attacks Near Becelaire and Poelcapelle Repulsed on Saturday.

LONDON, Oct. 14.—Field Marshal Haig's forces last night repulsed German reconnoitering detachments north of Poelcapelle and west of Becelaire, on extreme right and left ends of the new British battle line east of Ypres, in Belgium. The British are showing renewed activity further south. The war office today announced that a successful raid was made on the official report from Field Marshal Haig tonight. The text of the report reads: "Eastern county troops raided the enemy's trenches in the afternoon southeast of Monchy-le-Preux and captured several prisoners. 'On the battle front there has been

NEW LIBERAL PARTY STARTED IN QUEBEC, SAYS THE STANDARD

Proposes to Campaign Against Isolation by the Borden Government.

Montreal, Oct. 13.—A new organization of Quebec Liberals had a caucus here last night to discuss the political situation, and came to the conclusion that this province cannot be isolated from the rest of the Dominion, and that the interests of Quebec should prevail over party feelings, says the Standard today. Will Start Campaign. Continuing, the Standard says that at the meeting it was agreed to immediately start a campaign to operate against this isolation, and that Hon. J. L. Perron, M.L.C., and Hon. E. Beland, M.P., for Beauce, now interned in Germany, were selected as patrons of the new group. It was understood that Mr. Perron will direct the campaign. The intention of these Liberals is to have a constitutional candidate in every constituency in Quebec, their program being that should the Union Government win the election they will be able to give it support and claim in the cabinet such representation as they claim they would be entitled to. Nationalists Barred. The new organization will make no alliance with the Nationalists. The Standard says the basis of dissatisfaction with the present government is that it remained under the influence of a cabinet, and lost all its strongest supporters outside of Quebec. This resulted in the complete isolation of Quebec. The new Government, the Standard further claims, has the very strong support of the wealthy French element, who are deeply interested in maintaining the Entente between Quebec and the other provinces of Canada. An official statement will be issued at the time next week, the Standard concludes.

FISH FROM ATLANTIC MISS LONDON THIS TRIP

TORONTO, Oct. 14.—A consignment of 35,000 pounds of Government fish, all Atlantic fresh cod and haddock, is now speeding westward by express from Mulgrave, N. S. It will be distributed today or tomorrow, as follows: Montreal, 1,000 pounds; Ottawa, 100; Kingston, 200; Toronto, 25,000; Hamilton, 500; St. Catharines, 200; Cornwall, 1,000; Galt, 200; Walkerton, 500; Sarnia, 300; Windsor, 3,000.

CONTROLLER OF FUEL AIMS TO RESTRICT RETAILERS' PROFITS

Proposes Limit of 50c Per Ton—Consumers Must Store Little.

OTTAWA, Oct. 14.—Regulations are being framed by C. A. Magrath, fuel controller, for the fixing of profits on the sale of coal by brokers, wholesalers and retailers throughout Canada. It is understood that retail profits will be limited to 50 cents a ton, and wholesale dealers' and brokers' profits will be on a still lower scale. It is also likely that provision will be made to restrict the accumulation of coal in the hands of consumers. Complete machinery will be provided for the prosecution of any infractions of the regulations, which are said to be very drastic in their scope. The fuel controller in his new regulations is following closely the precedent established in fixing the price of coal in Great Britain, which deals with restrictions on profits of middlemen rather than cost of production. Part of this policy is forced upon the fuel controller by the fact that the largest coal fields in the world are in the United States and beyond his control.

INSTANTLY KILLED BY TOUCHING CAT CAUGHT IN A LIVE WIRE FENCE

LEAMINGTON, Oct. 14.—Mrs. Williams, wife of H. L. Williams, a prominent fruit farmer living on the 1st concession of Merens Township, was instantly killed shortly before noon today. She had been in to Leamington with her husband, and when in front of her home on returning saw her pet cat lying dead in the wire fence. She went to get it, and on touching the cat fell over dead. Investigation showed that the high wind had blown down one of the wires of the Edison Electric Power Company. It lay across the fence and as soon as Mrs. Williams touched the cat several thousand volts passed through her. Her husband while trying to remove his wife from where she had fallen received such a powerful shock that he was knocked down. Experts say that his escape from instant death was miraculous.

MAN FROM TILLSONBURG ELECTROCUTED AT 800

TILLSONBURG, Oct. 14.—Henry Jones received this afternoon the electric shock which he had earned for his son, Andrew, aged 23, who was only married ten days ago, was electrocuted Saturday at a big steel plant at Sault Ste. Marie. No details of the accident were received, but the remains are being brought home on Tuesday for burial. He went to the Sault Ste. Marie Steel Company. Some time ago he enlisted in "C" Company of the 15th Battalion, but was rejected before. He was a member of the 15th Battalion, Ben, who joined the 15th Battalion at Brantford, has been in the trenches for some time. Two sisters at home also survive.

NAVAL ATTACKS ON RUSSIA IN BLACK SEA AND BALTIC



German forces, after warships had silenced the Russian coast batteries on Oesel and Dagö islands, landed strong forces on Friday. On Dagö island, a village of Sero (on the southern part of the island) was occupied; on Oesel Island, Serel (on the Swoon Peninsula, the point on the map putting southeast) was occupied, the capital of the island, in flames, while the invaders are marching to the southeastern coast. German naval activity is also reported, in the Russian official statement, on the Black Sea, where a submarine has bombarded the port of Tuapse.

German Admiralty Forced to Modify Mutiny Boomerang

COPENHAGEN, Oct. 14.—The German admiralty has been forced to issue an explanatory statement regarding the mutiny in the fleet, in which Chancellor Michaelis and Vice-Admiral Capelle endeavored to place the blame on the Independent Socialist party, and now declares that the affair was confined to a single ship, where a few sailors endeavored to carry out a mutiny, but a propaganda. The admiralty denies flatly the report of a mutiny on the Nurnburg and four battleships.

VON CAPELLE SURE OUT. MAINLY ARTILLERY DUELS IN MACEDONIA

PARIS, Oct. 14.—The French official statement from Macedonia reads: "Eastern theatre, October 13: Artillery fighting was quite spirited at the Cerna bend. There was less activity on the other parts of the front."

SELECTIVE DRAFT TO BE DELAYED IN YUKON

DAWSON, Yukon Territory, Oct. 14.—A special dispatch from Ottawa says that owing to the remoteness from Ottawa, draft regulations will not be effective here for some time after publication in Canada.
