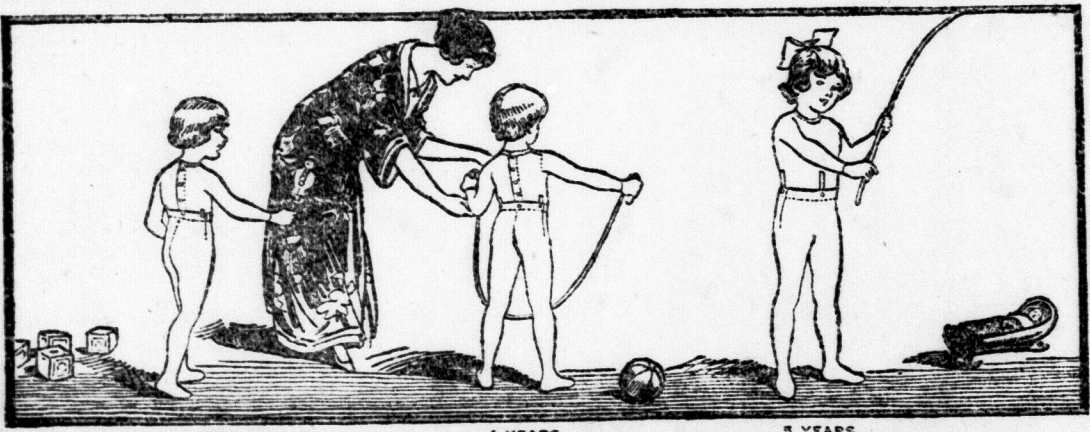

NORTH OF IRELAND RESIDENTS ANXIOUS TO COME TO CANADA

Hon. J. A. Calder Foresees Big
Influx of Old Country
Citizens Next Year.

SELECTED WITH CARE

Special Effort Made To Secure
People Who Will Go On
the Land.

NEW YORK, Sept. 20.—(By Canadian Press).—Hundreds of residents of the north of Ireland are anxious to emigrate to Canada, according to Hon. J. A. Calder, minister of immigration in the Dominion cabinet, who arrived here Saturday on his way back to the capital after an extended trip of inspection of the Canadian immigration offices in the old country.

Did Not Visit Ireland. Mr. Calder visited the agencies of his department in England and Scotland and found the organization working efficiently. He did not go to Ireland, but to a Canadian Press correspondent he stated that reports he had received from the Belfast office showed that there was unusual activity there.

Our Belfast office has had many inquiries from prospective immigrants recently," he said, and there are indications that Canada will get many new citizens from the north of Ireland. Our Dublin office, however, owing to conditions prevailing at present, is merely marking time.

Big Tide of Immigration. Mr. Calder said that particular care was being taken by the old country representatives of the department in passing upon the immigrants and that every effort was being made to secure people who would go on the land. He declared that those who were being accepted at present were of a remarkably fine class, and said that, judging from the inquiries at the various offices in England and Scotland, there would be a big tide of immigration to the Dominion next year.

Mr. Calder left on Saturday for Ottawa. He will remain a few days at the capital before going West on business in connection with his department.

LIVE HOG INDUSTRY LOSES \$11,000,000 IN SEVEN MONTHS

Loss is Attributed To Sale of
Breeding Stock in
1919.

OTTAWA, Sept. 20.—The live hog industry of Canada sustained a loss of approximately \$11,000,000 during the seven months ending July 31, 1920, represents the difference in value between the visible hog marketings during that period and the same period of 1919. The loss in revenue is attributed to the liquidation of breeding stock during 1919.

BELFAST CITY IS WOMAN AND CHILD SCENE OF MANY BRUTAL MURDERS

Policeman Is Murdered On
Saturday Night.

REVENGE FOLLOWS

Three Civilians Are Taken
From Their Beds and
Shot.

BALLINAMORE, Ireland, Sept. 20.—Several men were dragged from their homes by uniformed men yesterday, and forced, with their hands to avoid the police, to go to a police station. The police were told that the action was necessary to have taken them in reprisal for an attack on the local police barracks Friday night.

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It is also officially denied that Mrs. MacCurtain was shot at, or that there was any threat to her home, as was reported in the newspapers.

Mr. MacCurtain's Saturday night said that Mrs. MacCurtain reported that a shot was fired at her while she was walking in the park of her home. She said her home had been raided on the previous night.

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Policeman Killed, Companion Injured. Previously the shootings in this city had occurred in the heat of the riot, but now, for the first time, deliberately planned killings have been carried out. The affair took place at night, and the police were shot in the chest and the wounding of two others and the rapid succession of events which followed.

At about the same time Constables Farrell and Keenan were fired upon in a locality about a mile from the scene of the other attack. The assailants sprang upon the policemen unexpectedly. Farrell was shot in the arm, Keenan was knocked down and several shots were fired at him while he was on the ground. Some of the bullets passed through his cap without touching his body, and he came out of the affair unscathed. Farrell was taken to a hospital.

Vengeance Was Swift. The reprisals came swiftly. Shortly after 3 o'clock this morning, three civilians, Edward Trodzen, John MacPadden and John Gaynor, who lived in the same house as the policeman, were shot in their homes. Different parties visited each house. Four men took part in the shooting of Trodzen, who was a barber. After knocking at the door they fired a shot through the barber shop window. Trodzen's son opened the door and the men, wearing masks, rushed upstairs. They dragged Trodzen to his room, where several shots were fired at his head, shattering it. The men immediately left without molesting the other occupants of the house.

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
