REPORT OF THE CHARITABLE COMMITTEE.

The Charitable Committee beg to report as follows:

Relief during the past year has been afforded to 367 families (including 434 children), and comprising in all 951 individuals, both residents and non-residents. Every case has been carefully investigated and substantial relief has been afforded to all who were found worthy.

The distribution consisted of the following items:

118 half-tons of coal,
30 half-cords of wood,
\$301.50 in groceries,
33 nights' lodging,
73 meals,
\$56.60 in cash,
