Manufacture And Sale And Free Importation After Nov. 14-The Milk Situation

Ottawa, Oct. 25—An order-in-council has been passed, upon the recommendation of the food controller, allowing, on and after November 14, the manufacture and sale of oleomargarine in Canada and its importation free of duty. Suspension of the prohibition of its manufacture, import or sale is a war measure only and will apply while the present abnormal conditions continue. The conclusion of such condition will be determined by the governor-general-in-council and after November 14, the manufacture 48¼ ed by the governor-general-in-council.
100 Persons wishing to manufacture or to 49% import oleomargarine must first obtain 149 a license from the food controller. 149½ 149
