

## 8 TENDERS IN FOR GRAND FALLS WORK

Will be Opened at Meeting of Power Commission This Afternoon.

Eight tenders for the construction of the dam, power house and other buildings in connection with the Grand Falls hydro development project were received at the office of the New Brunswick Electric Power Commission before 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon, the time of closing. All tenders were delivered at the office, in most cases by representatives of the firms submitting estimates. The tenders will be opened and dealt with at this afternoon's meeting of the Commission.

## 100 ARABS KILLED

Persians Storm Palace of Sheikh After Which Town is Sacked.

BAGDAD, Mesopotamia, July 30.—A hundred Arabs have been killed by Persian government troops which attacked the palace of the Sheikh of Muhammarrat at Fallahieh, where a band of Arabs established themselves July 24, after storming the town. Six Persians were killed. The scene of the trouble is at the head of the Persian Gulf, near the Mesopotamian frontier.

## Farmer Is Killed By Lightning in P.E.I.

CHARLOTTETOWN, P.E.I., July 30.—Myles Macdonald, 37, of Dartington, P.E.I., and two horses he was unloading from his hay mower, were instantly killed by lightning during a heavy electrical storm that swept over the western end of Prince Edward Island this morning.

Mr. Macdonald is survived by a wife and two children.
