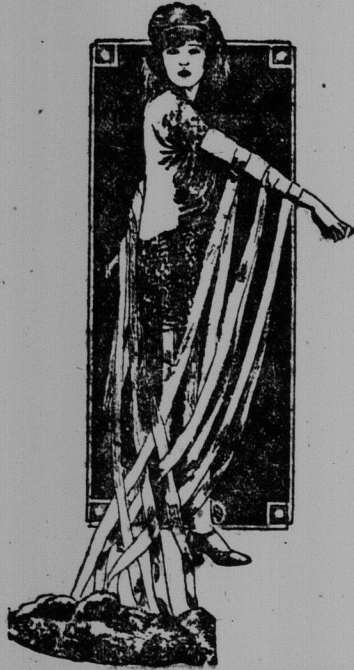

from behind in many of their games.

Cleveland called upon Uhlir or Bagby
in nearly all of its contests last week.
Errors were frequent in the fielding of
the Indians, Senators and Yankees.

Boston played only a few contests last
week and climbed into a tie for third
place with New York, by taking two
games out of three from the Athletics,
who are playing good ball.

Detroit, which won its third straight
game yesterday, is doing good work at
the bat and with a stronger pitching
staff would climb rapidly.

Although Chicago lost ground last

capped St. Louis.

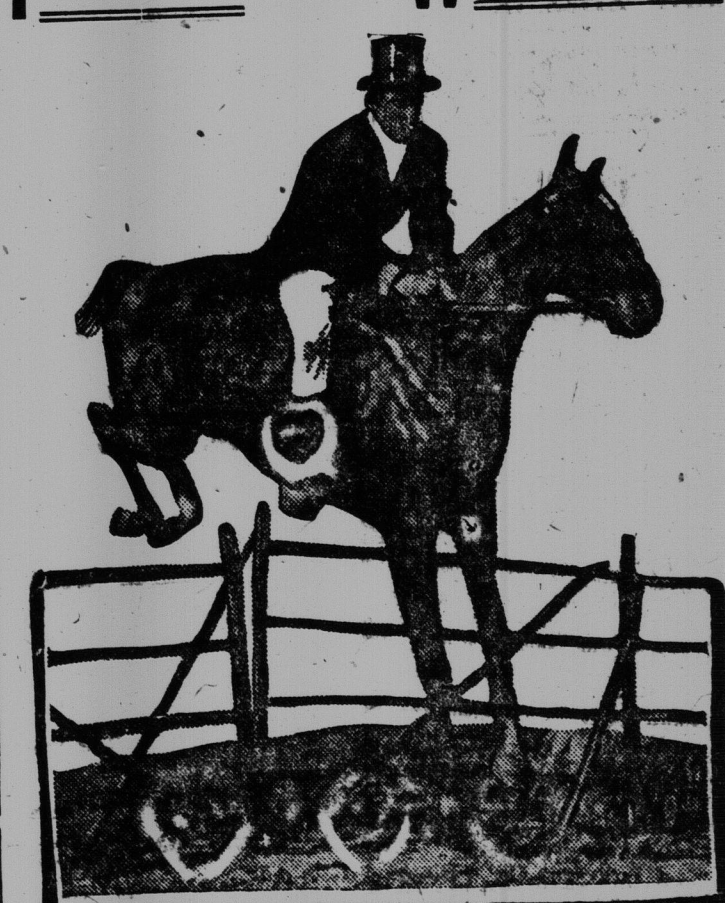

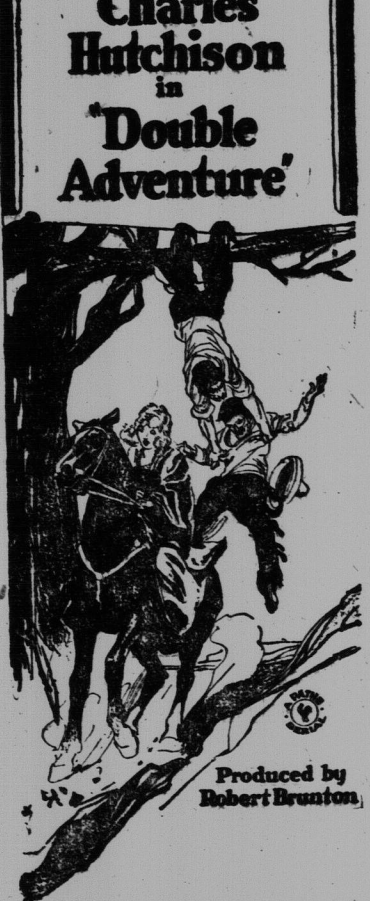
