Unless an amicable adjustment of differences is made between the officials of the New Brunswick Power Company and the employes, by 6 o'clock this evening, a strike of all workers in the gashouse, power house, street railway service and other branches of the company will be called immediately, affecting all the ear lines, the lights, electric power and gas supply of the city, according to a statement given out by the officials of the employes' union last night. A meeting of the executive of the company will be held this afternoon at 4 o'clock, when this matter will be considered.




