### RECENT DEATHS

Although he had been in ill-health for nearly a year and had been seriously ill for the last week, the death of James McGuire of Upper Loch Lomond, which occurred yesterday morning, came as a shock to his many friends, who received the news with sincere regret. ### HIGHER PAY FOR UNION EMPLOYEES OF THE G. N. T.

Toronto, Sept. 1—An agreement just signed between the Great Northwestern Telegraph Company and its union employees provides for a ten per cent increase for clerks, \$10 a month increase for automatic operators and \$20 a month increase for Morse operators.

This makes the maximum salary for Morse operators \$185 a month, and for automatic operators \$105. Overtime rates holidays and working conditions remain as before.

### TO SWIM 100 MILES.

New York, Sept. 1—Henry Ellonsky, formerly of New London, Conn., who doesn't think anything of swimming thirty miles with his hands and feet shackled, and who holds the record for long distance swimming, sixty-five miles, made in New York waters, will, on September 11, try to swim 100 miles without emerging from the water. His plan is to swim out to sea nine and a half miles, return, and then swim twice over a half-mile course, repeating the feat five times.

### GRAFOLA RELEASED IN WOMAN MURDER CASE

Hackensack, N. J., Sept. 1—Joseph Grafola, who with three others has been under detention by the Hudson county authorities in connection with investigation into the murder of Mrs. Blanche Schulz, whose body was found in a clump of bushes in Grantwood, N. J., was released yesterday. The authorities announced that nothing has been discovered to connect him with the murder.

### MOTH SETS FIRE TO WOMAN.

New York, Sept. 1—Mrs. Mary Malz 84, started to turn off the gas the other night. She stood on a chair and watched a moth circling the flame. The moth was caught and fell burning on the woman's shirtwaist, setting it afire. She was painfully burned.
