### Suburban Arrangement With F. P. Brady of the C.R. Recalled

#### Here is a Matter of Importance in Connection With the Agitation For Good Service

While the suburban residents are awaiting word from General Manager Goutin of the I. C. B. regarding the restoration of the suburban trains, the discussion of the situation continues. One matter which has received attention is the statement made by Mr. Goutin that there is no room in the winter time between Montreal and St. Anne's and also that St. John has a better winter suburban service than any other place on the continent. The C. P. R. time table under date of January 1, 1914, shows nine trains leaving Montreal each week day, and some of them on Sundays as well, making all the suburban stops. The suburban trains leaving Montreal leave at 7:35, 8:05, 8:40 a. m., 12:15, 1:30, 4:15, 6:15, 6:45, and 11:30 p. m. The suburban trains arrive at Montreal at 7:55, 8:45, 9:30 a. m., 12:30, 1:45, 4:30, 6:45, and 10:15 p. m.

### MEN TO REPLACE ALL THE GIRLS IN OFFICE OF NEW MAYOR OF BOSTON

#### Young Women to be Transferred to Other Departments—Reduction of Budget Looked For

Boston, Feb. 11.—Mayor Curley is arranging for the transfer of the girls employed in his office. On taking charge on Feb. 2 he said that he would not retain any of the women employed in the mayor's office, not that he did not have the friendliest feelings for them, but because he believed that men should make up the mayor's office. The telephone girls must go.

The mayor has arranged for Miss Elizabeth M. Hendley, chief clerk, to be transferred to the telephone department, to fill a similar position in the supply department at the same salary, \$1500. ### COURSE AT NAVAL COLLEGE IN HALIFAX L.E. GTHEARD

Having successfully completed their two years' naval course at the Royal Naval College of Canada in Halifax, eight cadets, three of whom are Nova Scotia lads, will sail on Friday of this week for the West Indies, there to join H. M. S. Berwick of the Fourth Atlantic Cruiser Squadron now in those waters. The nineteen Canadian cadets who were last year drafted on the ship are now returning to Halifax for an extra course at the naval college. They will be on board the R. M. S. P. C. O's steamer Chacure which sailed from Bermuda on Saturday for Halifax via St. John. It has been found that a course of two years is not of sufficient length to fully cover the necessary studies and these lads will be at the Naval College for another year, after which they will re-enter the British service. Henceforth the course at the naval college will be for three successive years instead of two. The cadets who leave on Saturday will be the third and last to return to the Berwick, after which they will return to Halifax to complete their shore course. The names of these eight cadets are: Southey, Montreal; Wood, Vancouver; Beach, Vancouver; Critchley, Halifax; N. S. Reid, Quebec; Taylor, Windsor; N. S. Lindsay, Ottawa; they will sail by the R. M. S. P. C. O's steamer Carquet.

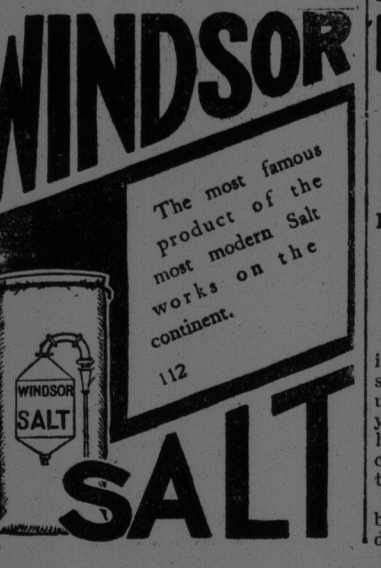
