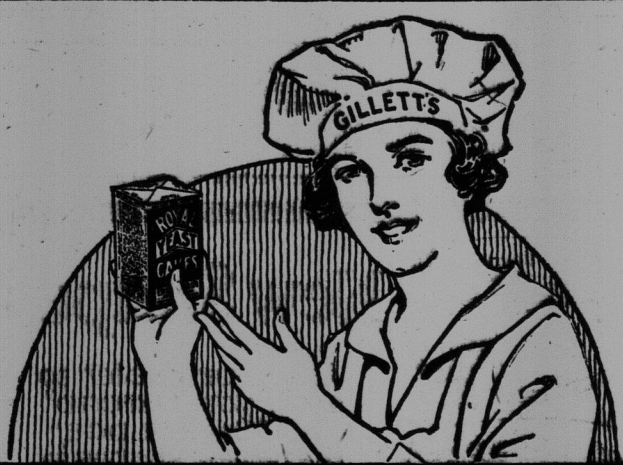

FREDERICTON, April 8.—Free distribution of school text-books, prescribed by the Board of Education, will be under the direction of an official to be sworn as the superintendent of school books.

This is one of the provisions contained in an act introduced this afternoon in the House by Hon. I. C. Rand, Deputy-Chief Minister. The bill provides for the purchase, sale and free distribution of school books in New Brunswick, and the Government has agreed to carry out the act.

DISTRIBUTED FREE.
The purchase and selling price of a text book shall be fixed by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, and it is so stated in the act that pupils up to and including Grade V, and ungraded standard II, shall be given these text books free of cost. The expenditure necessary to carry out the act shall be met from the consolidated revenue of the province.

Canada To Cut South African Ship Subsidy

OTTAWA, April 8.—The government's subsidy to the Canada-South Africa Steamship Line will be cut this year from \$125,000 to \$100,000. It was stated in the House of Commons today in answer to a question.

Traffic carried by this line to South Africa during the last four calendar years amounted to \$30,007,483 from Canadian ports and \$3,796,898 from United States ports.
