

DISASTROUS FIRE SWEEPS MILFORD

A fire which broke out in Milford at 1 o'clock last evening and fanned by a stiff breeze raged for several hours, destroyed property which was said to be valued at \$100,000. The bakery, grocery store, residence, barn and practically all the stock, of Dwyer Brothers were burned and it was estimated that the loss of this firm was in the vicinity of \$80,000. Other properties which were preyed upon by the fire were the residence of



Thomas Evans, including the Milford Post Office, a landmark for many years, the home of Thomas McGrath, a house belonging to William Stout, the "Old Crowley House," occupied by two tenants, William Shannon and Thomas Kane, and the residence of Patrick McBiarty. Several sheds were also destroyed and four horses belonging to Dwyer Brothers perished in the flames. There was no loss of human life and no accidents took place.

The fire originated in the rear of Dwyer Bros. bakery and spread rapidly to the surrounding buildings. It burned until about eleven o'clock though the ruins were still smouldering at an early hour this morning, necessitating the keeping of a guard on them. All the buildings are said to have been partly covered by insurance, though the losses will be heavy. Only the valiant work of the Fairville Volunteer Company assisted

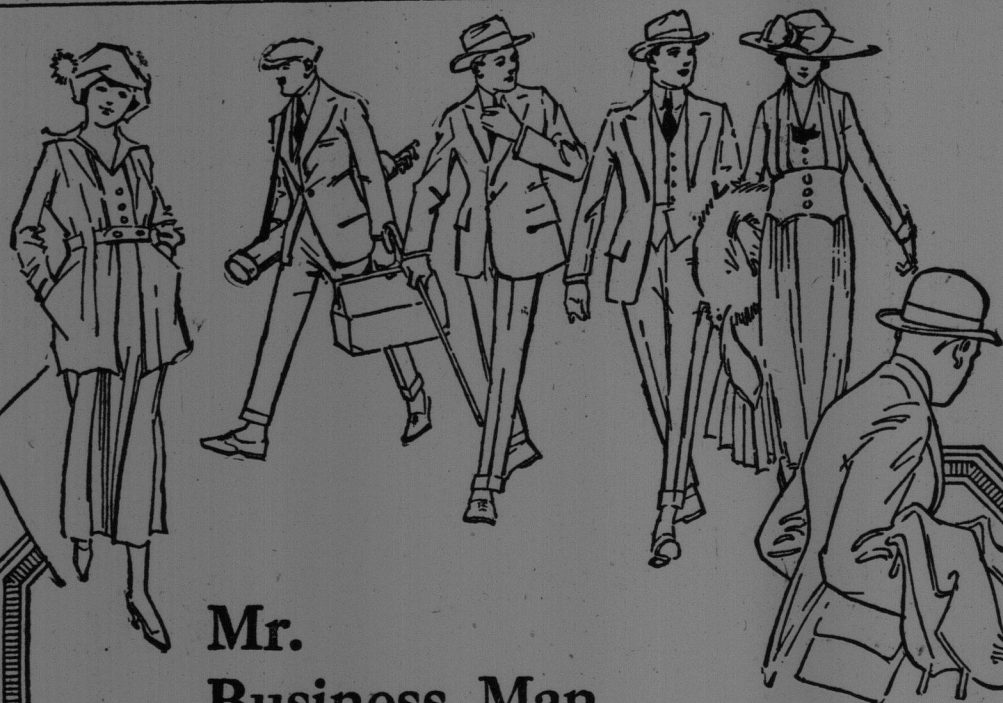
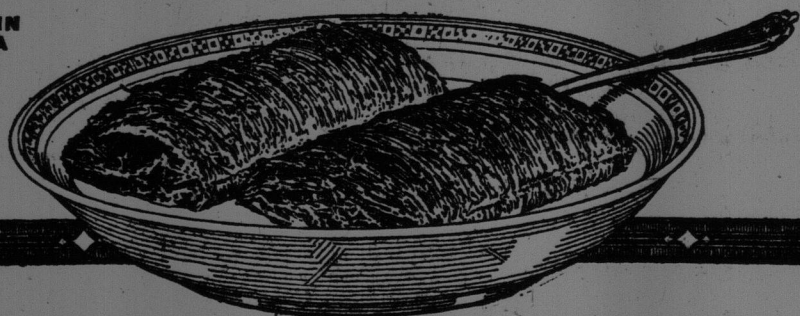
