Q-12. Have you any further documents?

I further produce M.F.M.216, which is a certificate of apprehension by or surrender to service authorities. It relates to the accused and says that he was apprehended at Theesalon, Ont., 5 February 1944.

It is signed by L/Opl.R.E.Anderson, i/c 32 Coy Cdn Pro Corpe, Sault Ste.Marie, Ont., and is dated 6 February 1944.

PROSECUTOR:--If I may I will tender this as evidence.

PRESIDENT TO DEFENDING OFFICER:--Have you any objection?

DEFENDING OFFICER:--No objection.

M.F.M.216, is read, marked Exhibit "K" signed by the President, and attached to the proceedings.

Q-13. Have you any further documents?

I further produce M.F.B.1481 which refers to the accused and sets out particulars of transportation charges which are chargeable to the accused in the amount of \$74.55. It is dated at Newmarket, Ont., 14 February 1944, and signed by T.Gillespie, Capt.& Adjt., No. 23 C.A.C.(B) T.C., C.A.

PROSECUTOR:--If I may I will tender this as evidence.

PRESIDENT TO DEFENDING OFFICER:--Have you any objection?

DEFENDING OFFICER:--No objection.

M.F.B.1481 is read, marked Exhibit "L" signed by the President, and attached to the proceedings.

Q-14. Have you further documents?

I further produce M.F.B.1452 which sets cut the particulars of incidental expenses in connection with the accused to the amount of \$10.50. This document is dated at Newmarket, Ont., 14 February 1944, and signed by W.E.Hally, Sgt., who is the MCO in charge of the escort. I identify the accused as the person referred to in this document.

PROSECUTOR:—I will tender this document as evidence if I may.

PRESIDENT TO DEFENDING OFFICER: -- Have you any objection?

DEFENDING OFFICER: -- No objection.
