

In May last Mr. W. H. Arnold, of Port Arthur, made an application for the right to cut pulpwood ties etc. on what is known as the Gull River Indian Reservation on Lake Nepigon. At that time one C. W. Cox held these cutting rights under an agreement which expired on July 1st, 1925. Unfortunately this agreement was extended by the Indian Department for a period of two years, without Mr. Arnold being given an opportunity to press his claim.

applying for the right to out ties and pulpwood etc. on what is known as the Martin's Falls Indian Reservation, adjoining Long Lake, east of Lake Nepigon. I am enclosing you an agreement made by Mr. Campbell with the Band of Indians residing on this Reservation. The agreement is signed by the Cheif (there being no councillors) and is witnessed by Mr. S. A. Taylor, the Hudson Bay Agent at Long Lake, who interpreted for Mr. Campbell.
