

Brophy, surge of the St. John Society for the Prevention of Tu-berculosis reported that she had 98 aduit and 44 children patients under her care during the month. Fifteen were new cases. Three persons were discharged as non tubercular, five were sent to the County Hospital, and two to the Jordan Sanitorium. 1.102 visits were made to former patients, and 26 to new patients. It was announced that Dr. T. Fred Johnron had resigned as civic veterin-ary and had accepted a position with the Health Board, under a new salary basis and a new disposition of travel-ing expenses.
