## Matriculation.

The regular Matriculation Examination begins on the day named in the Calendar.

Any person of the full age of fifteen years will be admitted to the examination on producing satisfactory evidence of good moral character. The holder of a certificate or license required of Male Teachers of the first-class in either of the Provinces of Canada will be exempted from examination in English, History, Geography, and Mathematics.

Candidates for Matriculation will be required to pass a satisfactory examination in the following subjects:

- 1. Latin. Cæsar, Gallic War, Book I.; Vergil's Æneid, Book I.; Cicero, two Orations against Catiline, or the Manilian Law; Latin Grammar (Harkness' Abridged is preferred); Smith's Principia Latina, Part IV: Exs. 1-25, or the equivalent.
- II. Greek. Dr. Smith's Initia Græcæ, Part I.; Xenophon, Anabasis, Book I.; or Book IV.; Greek Grammar (Hadley's Abridged is preferred.)
- III. Mathematics. Arithmetic; Algebra to the end of Quadratic Equations; Geometry, as in Hamblin and Smith, Books I.-IV. (inclusive), or the equivalent thereof.
- IV. English. For 1889:—Grammar, Writing from Dictation; and a short composition upon a subject drawn from one of the following works: Shakespeare's Julius Cæsar and Merchant of Venice; Longfellow's Evangeline; Macau-
