
PROPOSES AERIAL MAIL AND PASSENGER LINES AND GRANTS CONCESSIONS

ST. JOHNS, Nfld., May 29.—Newfoundland, which has suddenly found itself the center of world aviation, soon may be connected with Canada and the United States by aerial mail and passenger lines, it developed today when the Lower House of the colonial Legislature ratified concessions granted the Imperial Air Craft Manufacturing Company, London.

According to a representative of the company, who recently arrived here, service will first be introduced between St. John's and Montreal. He said the distance would be covered in 16 hours.

Various expeditions assembled here to attempt a Transatlantic flight today found their preparations halted because of the difficulty in obtaining workmen to assist at their airdromes. Newfoundlanders are too intent on welcoming the SS. Corsican from overseas, bearing returning Newfoundland troops, to occupy themselves with other matters.

SEAPLANE COMMANDER ANXIOUS TO COMPLETE FLIGHT ON MEMORIAL DAY

WASHINGTON, May 29.—A though the navy department had received no word up to a late hour night from Lisbon, where the plane NC-4 is awaiting the start of Plymouth, England, on the last leg of the American Transatlantic flight, officials were of the opinion that the ship would "hop off" tomorrow.

ON MEMORIAL DAY

BREST, May 29.—The U. S. States naval seaplane NC-4 will probably start from Lisbon tomorrow weather permitting. Lieut. Commander Read, in charge of the craft, will be to reach England on Memorial Day, according to a wireless message picked up here from the United States ship, Rochester, which is lying in roads at Lisbon.
